To identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.</p> <p>Animals including Humans To identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. To recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function.
